Dennis' Dialogue:

“Those Annoying Notices”



Last week I received a renewal notice from a wood magazine I have taken for several years. They were offering me a half off rate to go ahead and renew now. The problem was I had just renewed for two years the month before! Talk about getting ahead of the ball... It seems a bit annoying to have someone always trying to get you to be sure that you don't let your subscription run out. But on the other hand, if you don't renew, there will come a day when you will miss your favorite publication, and you discover you missed the opportunity to keep it coming by not renewing on time. Of course, you can always contact the company and start over again, but its what you missed in between time that you may not be able to obtain.

Summer and Fall seem to be the season for church renewal or revivals. We all know about those revivals that start with homecoming. (A sneaky way to bait you into revival with food – works with Baptists every time!)

I can't help but wonder how many times the Lord has reminded me to walk a little closer to Him or to find some time to get away from the telephone and computer and to wait on His presence in my life. Every now and then I find I am growing a little weary, or feel some emptiness in my life or even getting cranky with life. Its then I begin to wonder if I missed a renewal notice for my spirit. It isn't those earth shaking times of crisis, or need, or difficulty that I am aware I have missed it. It shows up in my daily walk and fellowship with Him. I am rattling on in my own way of doing things, and all of a sudden, I discover I am on a different path than He is on. Often the awareness that I missed something begins with a simple sense that something is missing.

The Lord doesn't do blaring commercials, or front page ads or even computer pop ups. He sends a gentle renewal notice saying He is missing our time together. In quietness and often in stillness, He reaches the depth of my heart and says it is time to restore and renew the closeness of our fellowship. The old hymn says, "...and He walks with me, and He talks with me, and He tells me I am His own. And the joy we share, as I tarry there is like no other has known." The amazing thing about renewing my walk with the Lord is that I always come away saying, "Why didn't I do that sooner?"

There is in my office a cross stitch, given to me several years ago, that reads: "If you don't feel close to God, guess who moved" I usually find the Lord right where I left Him, not where He left me. It is a good reminder to keep the relationship up to date and not to wait until I find that I am going my way instead of His way. I will pray for you and for myself that in this season of church renewal and revival, we will all renew the "subscription" of close fellowship with the Lord.

Consider this.....

This is the season for Homecomings including churches and football. Football Homecoming may have started this great tradition. They were started by colleges and universities since the mid-19th century. The University of Missouri was the first, according to Jeopardy, to invite the alumni to attend a game and call it Homecoming.

I'm not sure if churches copied this practice from the universities or the opposite. I do know this is a strong tradition. In many churches revival services usually follow Homecoming. Churches sometimes invite former Pastors back to preach along with inviting back former members. These are members who have left the church for personal, spiritual or relocation reasons. They are invited back to the home church where many met Jesus as Savior and began their journey of faith. Also it is a chance to visit and fellowship with people they haven't seen in a long time.

Sunday, August 14, we were invited to Bethel Baptist Church for their 150th Anniversary and Homecoming. The church was organized on August 2 1861 during a dark day in our country's history. This church has a rich history and has always recovered even through two destructions by fire. We enjoyed worshipping with them as Dr. Burton led in challenging the church for the future.

The next Sunday we went back to Wadeville Baptist Church which was my first pastorate from 1973-1976. We had a wonderful time worshipping and renewing former acquaintances. Jackie Byrd rode with us back to her home church for Homecoming. Her husband, Rev. Robert Byrd, is buried at the church cemetery along with many of their family. I have wonderful memories of this first pastorate. They were so good to me.

August 28th, was another Homecoming. We were invited to Euto Baptist Homecoming in observance of its eighty-fifth anniversary. I have asked numerous times about the origin of the name. Euto's history states that local soldiers in Revolutionary War fought in the battle of Eutaw Springs in Orangeburg County, S.C. in 1781 under General Nathanael Greene. The battle of Eutaw Springs was one of the hardest fought and bloodiest battles of the Revolution and was the last major engagement of the war to take place in the South. When they came home they named an important crossroads Eutaw. Later the spelling was changed and it became Euto. Years later the State Highway Commission changed the name of that crossroads to New Salem. The Baptist Church held onto the name of Euto Baptist Church. So now you know the history of the name. (my comment) The history of this church has roots of principle and sacrifice, and this history continues in the life of the church. We had a great worship experience with the wonderful people of Euto.

Homecomings are a great tradition in Baptist churches and a tradition worth keeping. It is important to know our history to continue the great tradition of our Baptist faith. One day we will have a great Homecoming, and we will greet those we haven't seen for a while. Meanwhile, let our church Homecomings prepare us for that day.
